What is an Idiom? An idiom is a phrase which means something different from the meanings of the separate words that are a part of it. Usually it cannot be understood by the literal interpretation of the words that make up the expression. Used together, the words convey a meaning that is often unrelated to the individual words in the idiom. Some idioms have become so well worn that they are also cliches: overused or commonplace expressions. Some idioms are slang. They may be used to create an effect such as shock, irreverence or exaggeration.

How the Idioms Were Selected. The idioms have been selected because they occur frequently in native speech or in reading material used by English language learners. Many of them are not found in standard dictionaries. Approximately 400 idioms are defined, and this is only a small selection from the thousands of idioms that exist in English.

How to Locate an Idiom. As far as possible, the idioms are listed in alphabetical order by first word. The only "first" words not used to list expressions are the verbs *be and have*, articles (*the*, *a*, *some*), pronouns and possessives (*someone*, *one's*) and negatives (*no*, *not*). If you are unable to locate a particular idiom by what you think is its first or *key word*, try looking under another word that you think is an important word in the idiom.

How Each Entry is Arranged. The idiom is given first. If there is an alternate form of the idiom, with a slightly different structure but the same meaning, it is given in braces {} or parentheses (...) immediately after the idiom entry or on the next line. The expression is then followed by a definition of its meaning. After this comes one, two, or three examples in context. Every attempt has been made to vary the grammatical structure in order to demonstrate more than one way the expression can be used. For example, the tense or the verb form may be different in different examples. Similarly, an attempt has been made to vary the contextual situations in which the idiom is presented in order to demonstrate its range of usage.

Occasionally an idiom has more than one meaning. In such cases, all the meanings are given and the example sentences that correspond to the different definitions are pointed out. Where appropriate, the meaning is followed by notes. It may include information on the origin of the expression, grammatical restrictions, subtle connotations of meaning, synonyms, antonyms similar expressions, related expressions and expressions for comparison.

Antonyms are expressions which mean the opposite of the idiom entry. Idioms that might be mistaken as similar or interchangeable or which should be compared to the entry, for some other reason are used for comparison. The Use of Pronouns. Some expressions take an object that is different from the subject, e.g. <u>I</u> gave <u>him</u> a rain check. In this case, the object pronoun in the idiom entry is someone: give someone a rain check. In other expressions, the object is always the same as the subject, as in <u>I'm keeping my</u> fingers crossed. Here, the object pronoun in the idiom entry is one: keep one's fingers crossed.

Symbols That Accompany the Entries. Some idioms are often, but not always, associated with a particular verb. For example, the expression *back to square one, (go)* is frequently used with the verb *go.*

Similarly, some expressions occur in one or more slightly different structures. The expression may or may not have a direct object after the verb. In cases like these, the expression is listed under its first word and the frequently used verb or optional object is included in parentheses.

Some of idioms, however, are slang, and although they might be used in everyday conversation and informal writing, as a rule they would not be used in formal or literary speech or writing.

Some expressions may have an alternate for one word without changing the meaning of the expression. An example is *sleep like a log/rock*. In this expression, the word *rock* is a common alternate for the word *log* and can be substituted for it without changing the meaning of the expression.

Certain expressions are listed and discussed together because, with a change of only one or two words, they take on the opposite meaning. An example is *slow [quick] off the mark.*

When the word *quick* is substituted for *slow*, it forms an idiom with the opposite meaning. Another example is *take [give someone]* a *rain check*. If *give someone* is substituted for *take*, the relationship is reversed.

Stand one's ground = to be firm or not to alter one's position; stick one's guns = стоять на своем

Stand out in the crowd = to be distinguishable from others, unusual and distinctive = выделяться из толпы



Stew in one's own juices = to suffer the consequences of one's own actions = вариться в своем соку, расхлёбывать свою кашу

Stick one's neck out = to take a risk; to go out on a limb = рисковать



Stick one's nose in smb's business = to try to find out about someone else's private business; to poke your nose into other people's business; to put your finger into pie = совать нос не в свое дело

Go into a stole-wall = to beat around the bush; hem and haw; to try but in vain = ходить вокруг до окола

Straight and narrow = to follow the path of correct social or ethical behavior; toe the line = быть чересчур правильным

Sweat blood = to work tooth and nail; to put a great deal of effort; to work very hard = зарабатывать кровью и потом

Sweep someone off his/her feet = to overwhelm someone, often causing him or her to fall in love; head over heels in love = вскружить голову
